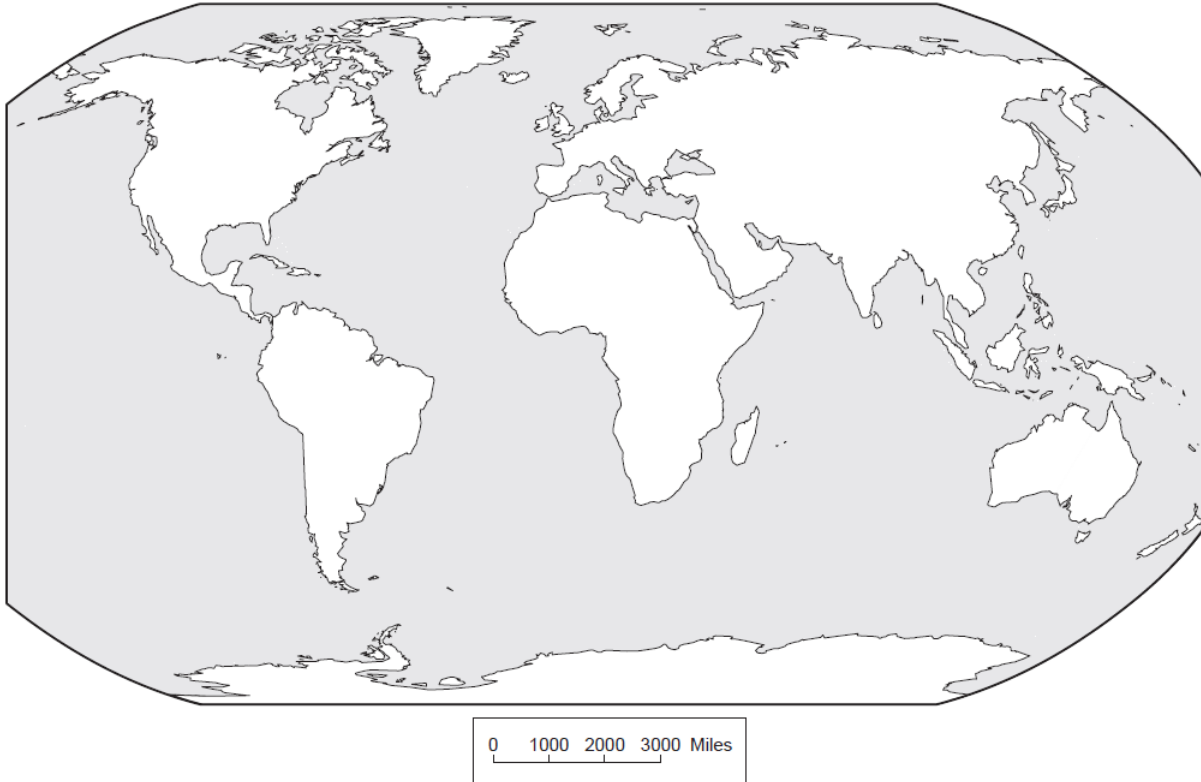


## Continents of the World

## MAP YOUR GROCERIES

Before you place an item in the grocery cart, see where the item is from and add a tally mark to the correct continent. If you don't know your countries very well, no problem! Just use a labeled world map, let your child look it up on your smartphone or have your child write the country name on the back of this paper and use an atlas when you return home. Depending on the age of your child, you can extend the learning in a number of ways. Here are a few ideas:

- Identify the products that traveled the farthest/shortest.
- Identify how many products came from each continent.
- Find the total cost of items from one or more continents. If you do multiple continents, you can make comparisons and find the difference.
- If you did not get an item from a continent (other than Antarctica), you can make it a goal to find something on the next visit even you don't buy the item.
